The next item on the agenda was Consideration of Temporarily Authorizing Students to Earn Practical and Theory Hours Online during COVID-19 Pandemic. The Board discussed the possibility of students of barbering, cosmetology, and other cosmetology-related services earning hours outside the physical premises of a school in light of the Coronavirus. It was concluded that the Board is not opposed to online training; Provided, all practical work should be completed under the direct supervision of a certified instructor within the physical premises of a school. It was also concluded that online training is not addressed in the Board's statute or legislative rules, so the Chair entertained a motion to add language to the Board's legislative rules that establish operational requirements and curriculum for schools that addresses online training and specifies the amount of clock hours a student can earn outside the physical premises of a school. On motion duly made by Catherine Donahoe and seconded by Melissa Kelley; the motion carried unanimously.
